

Montana Vehicle Licensing Guide



1) Form Your Limited Liability Company (LLC)

- Fill out your online, LLC application [here](#)
- After your submission, we will review your data, pay the required State fees and file your Articles of Organization.
- We'll send you an acknowledgement copy after filing.
- Time to completion: 1-3 days

NEED IT FASTER?

- Submit before noon mountain time.
- Specify **1-hour Expedite** in *Special Instructions* part of the LLC application. (\$200 fee)

2) Obtain Financing and Insurance

- Your vehicle license must be in the LLC name, not your name.
- All documents must reference the LLC as the owner with you signing as "Member"

- Your insurance must be for the LLC or added to a personal policy as *co-insured*

- Time to completion: variable
- **NEED IT FASTER?**
- Check to see if an Operating Agreement or Borrowing Resolution will be required
- Pay cash for your vehicle.

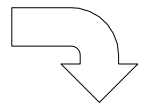
3) License your Vehicle, Boat or Aircraft

- Fill out the online, licensing application [here](#)
- After your submission, we will review your data, pay the required State fees and register your vehicle.
- We'll then Priority Mail you your registration copy and vehicle plates.
- Time to completion: 4-6 weeks for registration. 6-8 weeks for title production after registration

NEED IT FASTER?

- Check the **Registration EXPEDITE** box in the *License a Vehicle* online form. (\$350 fee)
- Check the **FedEx Plates Overnight** box in the *License a Vehicle* online form. (\$45 fee)

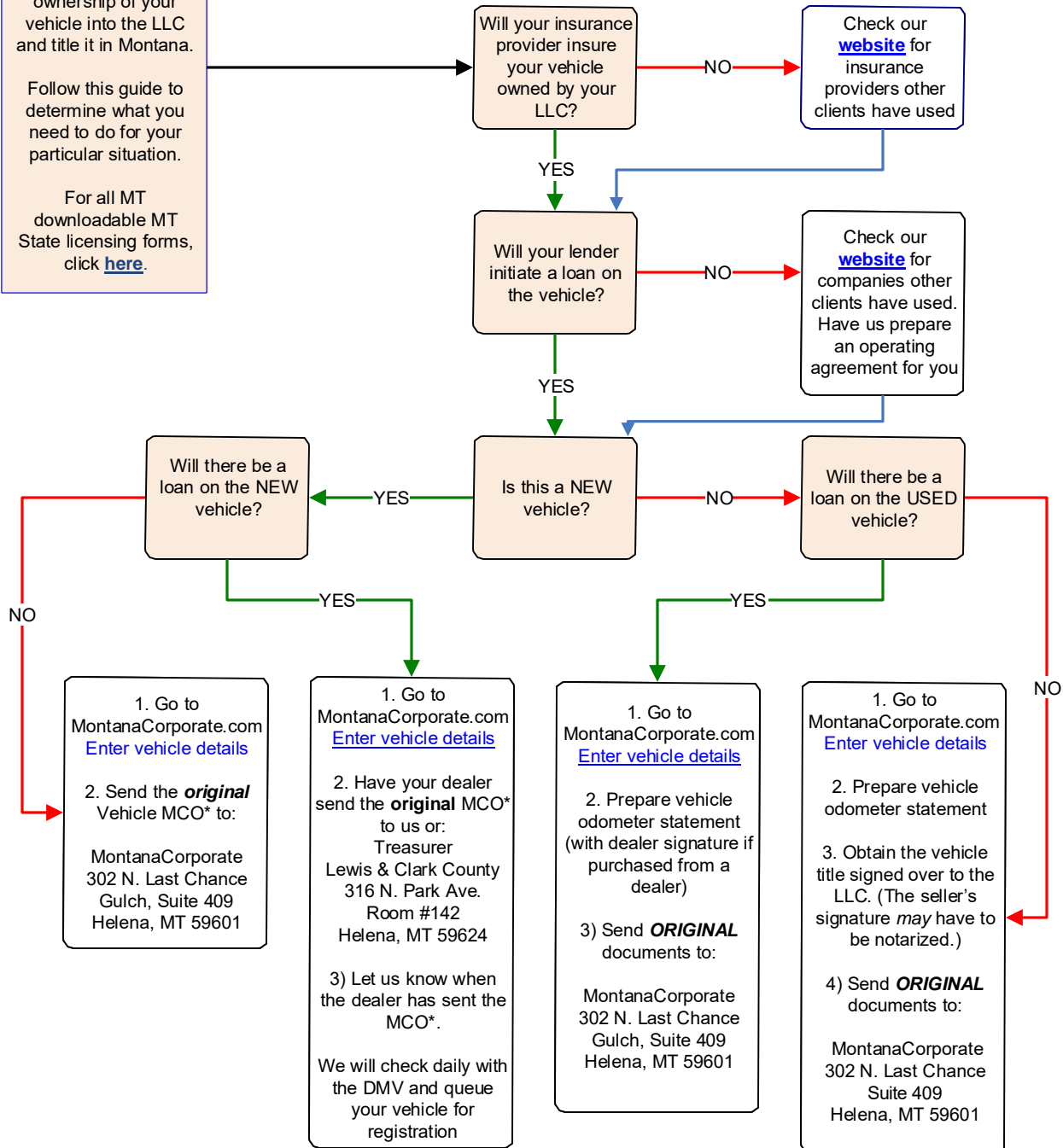


Decision Tree

*MCO: Manufacturer's Certificate of Origin. It certifies where the vehicle was built and is required on new vehicles only.
